Golf Ball Comparison Chart

Good=Value

Good is designed for the beginner player. They are typically a two piece ball and are firm for low spin to get more distance. These balls are great for the beginner player who needs to keep cost down while learning the game. While they are a good ball to start with, they are also perfect giveaways due to price point.

Better= Mid Level Player

Better is for the mid player, someone who enjoys the game yet is not a high level player. All balls in this category will play similarly with a firmer core and designed with more distance in mind. Some of the hybrid models offer a soft cover to give some feel around the green, like the DUO or Titleist TruFeel. (Softer feel when hit.)

Best= Tour Level Ball

Best are considered Tour level balls, played by the highest skill level players. Typically a three or more piece ball construction, soft cover and designed for feel (soft) around the green. All will play very similarly from start to finish, the only difference is price and brand.
